 - Be careful of trip hazards around campfires
 - Don't leave items too close to the fire
 - Put fires out completely
 - Hiking Safety

 - ∘ Tie a Shoe
 - o Cross the "Road"
 - You can use chalk to draw a "road" on a park sidewalk for this
 - Stay on the trail, look but don't touch "wildlife"
 - Position stuffed animals in the trees or bushes
 - Put a bandaid on a doll's "cut"
 - Stop! Do you see two leaders?
 - You can put this on a sign and have the kids stop and look around to point at two leaders
 - Walk around a "campfire"
 - Guyline maze

 - Talk about what we learned
 - Hand out child ID kits to fill out at home with parent
- Closing Ceremony
